Car Seat Law

Staff have been noticing that families are driving to and from the Center without restraining their children in approved safety seats. **California law states that children under 6 years and 60 lbs. must be in a car seat in the back seat of the vehicle.** This is a serious safety concern for children. We have contacted local police to do a drive through occasionally when families are coming and going; they will issue tickets to those not properly restrained. If you do not have a car seat and cannot afford one please see Norma Benitez, Family Resource Center coordinator for assistance.
